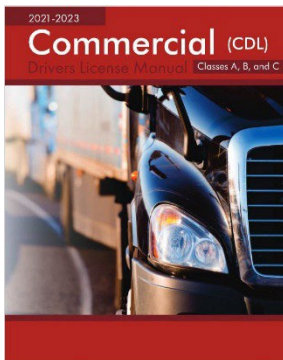


Part 1: The interactive two-day class will:
