Emergency Declarations

- Relief from 49 CFR Parts 390-399
- Regional Declarations
 - President
 - Governor
 - FMCSA
 - Maximum period of 30 days
- Local Declaration
 - Federal, State or Local authorities
 - FMCSA
 - Maximum period of 5 days
- Extensions of Emergency Declarations
 - FMCSA may extend Regional Declarations
 - Establish new time limit
 - Establish necessary restrictions

Emergency Declarations

• Emergency means any hurricane, tornado, storm (e.g. thunderstorm, snowstorm, ice storm, blizzard, sandstorm, etc.), high water, winddriven water, tidal wave, tsunami, earthquake, volcanic eruption, mud slide, drought, forest fire, explosion, blackout or other occurrence, natural or man-made, which interrupts the delivery of essential services (such as, electricity, medical care, sewer, water, telecommunications, and telecommunication transmissions) or essential supplies (such as, food and fuel) or otherwise immediately threatens human life or public welfare, provided such hurricane, tornado, or other event results in a declaration of an emergency

Emergency Declarations

- Emergency relief means an operation in which a motor carrier or driver of a commercial motor vehicle is providing direct assistance to supplement State and local efforts and capabilities to save lives or property or to protect public health and safety as a result of an emergency
- Direct Assistance means transportation and other relief services provided by a motor carrier or its driver(s) incident to the immediate restoration of essential services (such as, electricity, medical care, sewer, water, telecommunications, and telecommunication transmissions) or essential supplies (such as, food and fuel). It does not include transportation related to long-term rehabilitation of damaged physical infrastructure or routine commercial deliveries after the initial threat to life and property has passed

Waivers

- Temporary regulatory relief
 - From one or more eligible regulations in:
 - Part 382 Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing
 - Part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards and Requirements
 - § 390.19 Motor Carrier Identification Report
 - § 390.21 Marking of Commercial Motor Vehicles
 - Part 391 Qualifications of Drivers
 - Part 392 Driving of Commercial Motor Vehicles
 - Part 393 Parts and Accessories Necessary for Safe Operation
 - Part 395 Hours of Service of Drivers
 - Part 396 Inspection, Repair and Maintenance (except § 396.25, Qualifications of Brake Inspectors
- For up to 3 months
- Includes conditions imposed by FMCSA to ensure equivalent level of safety
